Crockham Hill C E Primary School is an over-subscribed school situated in a delightful, semi-rural setting. We admit 20 children each year over the 7 year phase from Reception to Year 6. This gives us a total of 140 children. This year we have restructured the classes slightly so that Key Stage 2 children are taught in year group classes of 20 for the mornings which is allowing teachers to focus on the specific demands of the National Curriculum in English and Maths for that age group.

We are extremely proud of the standards achieved by the time the children reach the end of their time at Crockham Hill. One measure of the standards is to look at how the children perform in the SATs (national tests) and then compare the results against other Kent schools and all schools nationally.

In July 2017 all the children reached the Expected standard in all subjects and significantly more reached the Higher standard as compared to other schools in Kent and nationally.
