EYFS Curriculum

Children learn best when they are able to think critically, take risks, challenge themselves and BE ACTIVE.

This year our Year R learners will have time to explore, discover, create and take risks through play based and child-led learning opportunities called 'COOL'.

Our indoor and outdoor learning environment motivates our children to take ownership of their learning and extend themselves far beyond the constraints of sitting at a table during a subject specific lesson.

Arrival Routine



When pupils arrive, they need to place their bookbags (MUST be the school bag) into the bookbag box, in the cloakroom, reading folders onto the nearest table as you come through the inner door, water bottles onto unit next to sink, find their 'minime' and start an individualised early morning activity.



Reading records

Please bring in reading folders every day. Please ensure that their Reading Records are in the Reading Folders even if you have not had time to read or practise phonemes with them at home.

Soon we will launch our annual reading army. They spend any morning they can spare between 8.40-9.00, hearing members of the class practise their phonemes and sight words.

If you are able to help, please offer! 4 adults can get through all 20 children in less than 20 minutes!





We follow the nationally accredited Scheme called Little Wandle.

Phase Two – First 19 initial phonemes – how to recognise, pronounce and blend.

Phase Three – sight words, remaining 25 phonemes such as 'ai' 'igh' etc, blending.

We expect ALL Reception pupils to be confident at Phase 3 by the end of the year. Some will exceed this expectation.

Children should come into school in their PE kits.
